CARF is an independent, non-profit organization that is focused on ensuring quality service in health and human services by following a set of standards and ensuring that agencies are meeting their outcomes. Pathways Abilities Society has been accredited through CARF since 2005, and we partake in an on-site survey every three years to ensure that we are meeting and recognize CARF accreditation standards. Based on the results of the survey, CARF prepares a written report of the agency's strengths and areas for improvement. If the agency has sufficiently demonstrated its conformance to the standards, it earns CARF accreditation. Pathways strives to be effective and professional in the delivery of its services, and our accreditation allows for continuous quality improvement.


