

She attended Wedding Bells and Baskets where she worked with Darlene & Helga for several years. When the Wedding Shop closed down, she attended 925 Sutherland Avenue Activity Services. We all moved to Pathways in Rutland in 2013. I worked very closely with her for

the past 15 years, 4 days a week at the Wedding Shop for a year, then the 925 House, Fuller Ave and Franklyn locations. For the past 7 years, on Mondays, we made cat toys and beds for the SPCA. Tuesday was her day off. On Wednesdays and Fridays, we volunteered at Mission Thrift Store, where she enjoyed assisting the Clothing Department Volunteers in the back of the store hanging up donated clothing. On Thursdays, she made bandages for Compassionate Canada. She enjoyed sewing the completed bandages together. She loved working on making Sock Monkeys with Barb who was a staff who retired a couple of years ago. My life is so much richer because I had that time with her. She will be truly missing by so many.

Memory from Darlene Hass: I have known Jeanne for 26 years. We went on Travel Club trips to places like Camp Owaissi on the Westside and stayed in cabins in Osoyoos and the Shuswap. 
