The level of on-site support in each employment area varies depending on the work location and tasks required to safely perform daily job requirements, including best fit for the employees abilities and skill set.

Pathways is <u>very fortunate</u> to partner with 4 Less Disposal who donates space in their workshop to house our commercial shredding machine. Shredding confidential documents is a source of revenue to create paid employment opportunities for employees with diverseabilities!

Travel Club Trips

Needless to say at this point, sadly we do not have any travel club trips planned for 2021. We do hope as time progresses and a vaccine developed, that we will again be able to explore our wonderful world!

555 Fuller Avenue Demolition

Sadly, yet happily the Pathway Abilities Society building located at 555 Fuller Avenue is demolished to construct housing units. Pathways (formerly the Kelowna and District Society for the Mentally Handicapped, the Kelowna and District Society for...Children, the Kelowna and District Society for the Mentally..., the Kelowna and District Society for the Mentally Handicapped and the Kelowna and District Society for Community Living) provided services out of the 555 Fuller location in Kelowna for 50 plus years until vacating the building in 2016.

On June 18, 1953 a group of parents, teachers, doctors and concerned citizens met and formed the original society because children with "mental handicaps" were not being educated in their community. The "centre" opened December 7, 1953. Many people with diverse-abilities received numerous types of services through-out the building's history; a school, a workshop, a woodshop (Kelowna Diversified Industries or KDI), a day care, a bike shop, employment and activity services (Sunnyvale) just to name a few. Though we are saddened by loss of a building that held so much of our history and memories-we are excited to move forward!



We are very grateful to the **Sunrise Rotary** for donating \$10,000 to Pathways towards the purchase of a gently used wheelchair van.

Society Updates

COVID-19 Update

We hope you are continuing to stay healthy and safe! We continue to provide services and have been preparing for the unpredictable colder weather while ensuring we are providing the safest service environment possible. Services have changed, will continue to change and will be very different. There are new requirements when attending. If you are not currently attending, please prepare now. Please go to our website and **ensure** you read and review our COVID-19 in the Service Site policy and procedure. If you cannot access the internet, please contact a supervisor or a manager and they will print and mail you a copy.

- *Wearing a mask is a requirement, understanding that for some this may not be possible. Please contact the area supervisor directly if you or the person you are supporting is unable to wear a mask, to plan how they will be safe and how we can make sure other people stay safe as well.
- * Temperatures will be checked when entering our buildings. If an above normal temperature is detected (above 38°C or 100.4°F), the person will have to go home.
- * Social distancing will be practiced and "imposed." There is no hugging, handshakes, fist pumps, etc. Physical contact of any kind will be limited to what is necessary however completed with the **utmost** respect.
- * If we identify or are concerned that a person attending is not well, they will be required to go home and may not be able to return until the pandemic is over.
- * If you are attending services at 123 Franklyn Road, in addition to the requirements outlined in the COVID 19 in the Service Site policy and procedure and in order to enable people to enter the building safely, individuals attending who travel independently or with a caregiver cannot attend or be dropped off before 9:00 am.
- *We have identified the maximum amount (capacity) of people that can be in the building at one time. If we reach that capacity and more people want to attend, we will be implementing an attendance schedule which may reduce a person's ability to receive services on certain days. We are committed to trying to accommodate all!

Just a reminder, if you fit into one of the following, until the COVID-19 crisis is

over, you still cannot attend our services. We are sorry however we are trying to protect you and the other people we serve.

- You are sick, especially if you have a fever.
 - You are medically fragile.
- You have a compromised (bad) immune system.
- You have respiratory disorders or problems with your lungs.

We miss those not attending and cannot wait to get back to the new normal. Take care and be safe and please contact us if you have any questions! Thank you.
