HADGRAFT-WILSON PLACE Building Complete!

Hadgraft-Wilson Place is named in recognition of two families who advocate for those with diverse-abilities and who have supported Pathways considerably. Hadgraft-Wilson Place provides affordable and subsidized rental units for people with limited incomes, families, singles, seniors and people living with diverse-abilities.

The goal of this building is to provide access to a safe and inclusive home for in our community.

There are 68 units in The Hadgraft-Wilson. There are 10 accessible apartments - which provide improved storage spaces and space for those living with mobility aids and diverse-abilities.

The Building Manager, Terry Ginther, is actively sharing Pathways mission to those renting in the building. He is creating an inclusive space and making sure that everyone feels safe at Hadgraft-Wilson Place.

The other 58 units comprise studio, single-bedroom, and two-bedroom apartments. Some of these units are subsidized units, providing extra relief for those needing it. Alongside these subsidized apartments, all other units are offered at a considerably lower cost than the current market rate.

1953 Sunnyvale - a school for the education of children with mental handicaps was established by a group of



1958

Sunnyvale Centre had 13 students & 2 teachers who taught ages 7-13 and 15-30 years old.



Sunnyvale Workshop was established. This workshop provided training for 42 adults in woodwork, ceramics, and handicrafts



1987

Although only operational for a year and a half, in 1987 the Society purchased the Korner Cafe and turned it into an "on the job" training restaurant called Champs



1973 The society moved forward from children's services to establishing Bertram residents for adults, Bertram was home for 12 diverse individuals



Services expanded and 4 new homes were purchased. This home served 16 individuals & offered respite on the weekends.



Focus was fully shifted to supporting the needs of adults with

diverse-abilities

The society was running four levels of vocational services including personal skills development and vocational training. The society served sixty-eight people and was supported by sixteen staff members.



To integrate further into the 1989 community, the society founded Wedding Belles and Baskets & Kelowna Diversified Industries Firewood Project -which served 21 people all together.



Kendra used to work as a motorcycle mechanic, so she told us that working with Bikeways was the perfect fit. Kendra has a huge heart for all those that Pathways and Bikeways support. She has worked tirelessly for decades to promote equality and rights for individuals who might otherwise not be heard. She was part of a 12-person cross-Canada team that assessed the medical support structure for the transgender community. This work led to a report highlighting the system's strengths and weaknesses. The report was widely distributed across Canada, and many recommendations were adopted. She hopes to be a good role model for future generations by being a light source in the community. Kendra told us, "It's not just about me and what I do here; it's about what we can do to help the community".
